

WHEREAS, the draft resolution on transfer of credit and General Education requirements across CUNY is of great concern to us (and our students).

AND WHEREAS, this policy essentially standardizes the curriculum and is likely to effectively reduce prerequisites for all majors.

WHEREAS, it is further likely to prevent students from obtaining the preparation they need at a time when such competence is critical for academic success.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that there be a separation of the three components in the draft resolution: Transfer, General Education, and Pathways to graduation, dealt with separately.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we postpone the consideration of the CUNY Draft Resolution and General Education requirements in order to work out transfer issues in a systematic matter with the input of different campuses and disciplines.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the colleges and Council disciplines have the opportunity to select their own representatives from the college's faculty or faculty governance bodies and be part of the Task Force and Working Groups.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the A.A.S. Community College degrees might require additional GEN ED credits when transferred to senior colleges.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we support the UFS Resolution that the GEN ED requirements should be composed of 30 credits + at least 16 credits implemented through the curriculum committee for each college.
